John 10

- I. Jesus speaks to the Jews after healing the man born blind (10:1–21)**
 - A. Jesus distinguishes between shepherds and strangers (10:1–6)**
 - B. Jesus explains and expands the illustration (10:7–18)**
 - 1. Jesus is the door (10:7–10)**
 - 2. Jesus is the good shepherd (10:11–18)**
 - C. The Jews are divided (10:19–21)**
- II. Jesus speaks to the Jews at the Feast of the Dedication (10:22–39)**
 - A. Jesus' sheep hear Him; the Jews were not His sheep (10:22–30)**
 - B. The Jews try to stone Jesus; He teaches them Scripture (10:31–39)**
- III. Jesus went beyond the Jordan; many believed in Him there (10:40–42)**

¹ "Truly, truly, I say to you, he who does not enter by the door into the fold of the sheep, but climbs up some other way, he is a thief and a robber. ² But he who enters by the door is a shepherd of the sheep."
