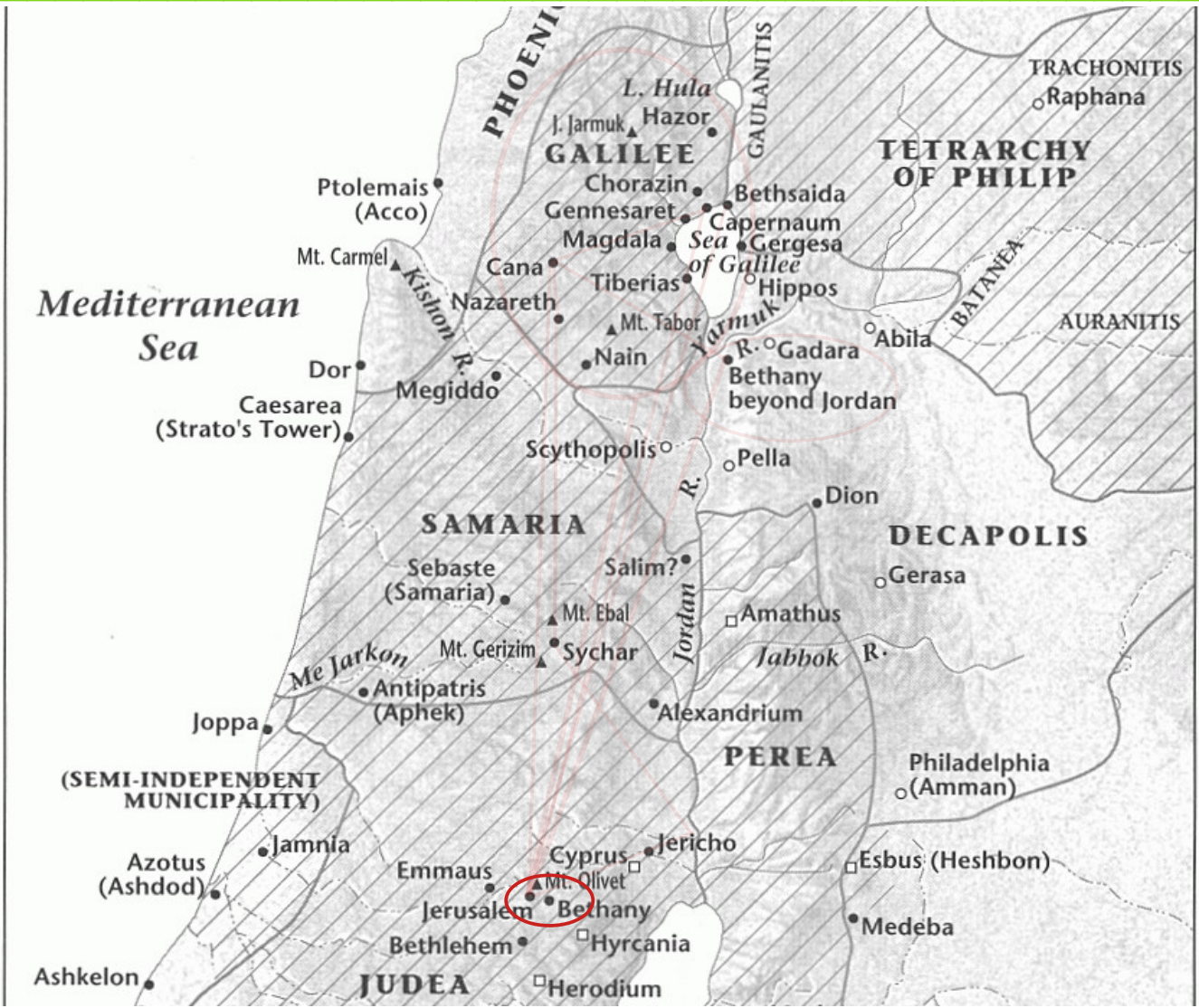

John 11:17

¹⁷ So when Jesus came, He found that he had already been in the tomb four days.



John 11:18–19

¹⁸ Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, **about fifteen stadia** away; ¹⁹ and many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary, to console them about their brother.

Less than two miles

John 11:20

²⁰ Martha therefore, when she heard that Jesus was coming, went to meet Him, but Mary was sitting in the house.

John 11:21–22

²¹ Martha then said to Jesus, "Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died. ²² But even now I know that whatever You ask from God, God will give You."

²³ Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again."

²⁴ Martha said to Him, "I know that he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day."

²⁵ Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in Me will live even if he dies,
²⁶ and everyone who lives and believes in Me will never die – ever. Do you believe this?"
