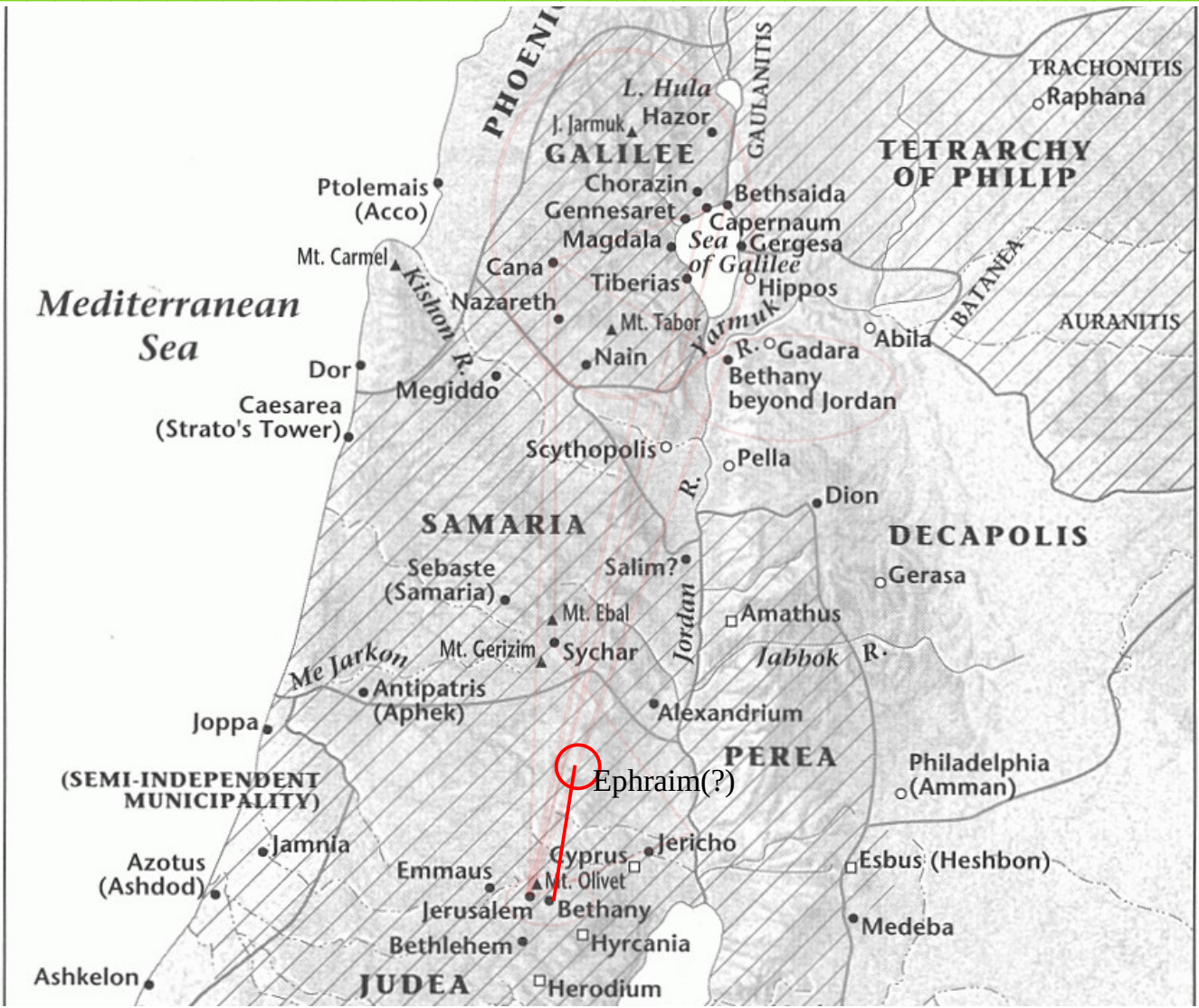
John 12
