#### **Passover Supper**

Matthew 26:17–36; Mark 14:12–31; Luke 22:7–38; John 13–17 Passover lamb was being sacrificed (Mk. 14:12); Jesus sent two disciples into Jerusalem (Mat. 26:17–19; Mk. 14:12–16; Lk. 22:7–13). Jesus washed His disciples' feet (John 13:4–12). One of them would betray Him (Mat. 26:21; Mk. 14:18; Lk. 22:21; Jn. 13:21). Jesus sent Judas out (John 13:26–30). Jesus instituted the "Lord's Supper" / Communion (Mt. 26:26–29; Mk. 14:22–25; Lk. 22:19–20). Jesus predicted Peter's denial (Jn. 13:38).

They sang a hymn, and went out (Mt. 26:30; Mk. 14:26).

<sup>1</sup> Now before the Feast of the Passover, Jesus knowing that His hour had come that He would depart out of this world to the Father, having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them to the end.
