<sup>17</sup> Some of His disciples then said to one another, "What is this He is telling us, 'A little while, and you will not see Me; and again a little while, and you will see Me'; and, 'because I go to the Father'?" <sup>18</sup> So they were saying, "What is this that He says, 'A little while'? We do not know what He is talking about."
