^{31a} So Pilate said to them, "Take Him yourselves, and judge Him according to your law."

^{31b} The Jews said to him, "It is not lawful for us to put anyone to death," ³² in order that the word of Jesus which He spoke would be fulfilled, signifying by what kind of death He was about to die.
